Summary of Funding for PE and Sports spending 2017/18

East Staffordshire Sports Partnership – To maintain participation in competitions and collaborate with PE specialists across the partnership – \pounds 1,200

Resources – New equipment purchased for PE lessons/ Playground Leaders/ Sports Day – £700

After School Clubs Subsidised - Burton Albion/ASM to deliver a subsided after school club on Wednesdays and Thursdays throughout the year - ± 800

Year 3/4 Swimming – Specialist coaches to deliver the Swimming over the summer term (11 weeks) and to support teacher training and delivery – £900

Professional Development Opportunities - Classroom cover to allow the PE Co-Ordinator/other staff to attend meeting - \pounds 2,000

PE Curriculum Leader/Coaching Opportunities £4,000

Transports to Sporting Events - Coach costs to Competitions/ Sporting festivals/ Swimming/ - £950

American Themed Sports Week - Specialist coaches to come into school with the correct equipment and deliver a range of new activities - \pounds 1,000

- More children attending after school clubs after introduction of Yoga and Boxercise - increase number of girls
- New playground equipment has seen a rise in children that are active during breaks
- As a result of Sports Week, children have experienced some sports for the first time (Cheerleading/ American Football/Basketball)
