Literacy	Nursery- will be making their own marks and beginning to give meaning to them. We will be retelling stories and beginning to learn some letter sounds. Reception – will be learning new sounds during our daily phonics' sessions We will be writing short sentences and retelling stories and events. We will be using our phonics' knowledge to read short sentence and read some words by sight.	
Mathematics	Nursery - will complete lots of practical activities looking at length and height. We will focus on the numbers 3 and 4. Reception—follow the White Rose Maths Scheme. We will be learning about the composition of numbers to 10 and learning about the properties of 3D shapes. We will continue practising our quick recall of number bonds to 5.	
Understanding the World	 This half term we will be: Learning about special events – St David's Day, Easter and Mother's Day. Investigating different materials and finding out which can let light through. Which materials would the wolf be able to blow? Drawing maps to help locate the hidden Easter Eggs. Observing how materials change as we make Easter biscuits. 	
Expressive Arts and Design	We will use different resources to make our own pictures and junk models. We will learn about different techniques including weaving and find out about the British street artist Banksy.
